Eva Mendes reveals she doesn't let her daughters use the internet

Eva Mendes has recently revealed that she doesn't let her and Ryan Gosling's daughters use the internet. The actress, 49, took to Instagram on 3 August to share one of the rules that she has for her and Gosling's daughters—Esmeralda, eight, and Amada, seven. Mendes shared a video of herself shaking her head no and wagging her finger, as she pointed out that's how she responds to her children when they ask to use the internet. In the caption, she wrote [this is what I do] "when my kids ask me if they're old enough to go on the internet, social media or anything requiring wi-fi".

As would be expected, many people commented her post. One fan asked when she will allow her children to use the internet. Mendes candidly confessed that she's still figuring that out. She also specified that she's been doing research on how social media can impact children as they continue to get older. "I honestly don't know. I have to see where it goes. For now, I'm observing them and keeping up with research about how social media can impact a child's brain".

When another fan praised her parenting decision, Mendes noted that while she's "just sharing what [she] feels now", she thinks it'll be harder to keep her children away from the internet as they get older. She clarified that her children are still given screentime, adding: "I let my kids use the iPad to make movies and watch films I've downloaded, but I don't have internet access on the iPad".

The actress was also hit with some criticism for her parenting rule, with one Instagram user writing: "We are in the internet century so eventually everyone will need or want to access the internet". This comment appears to have been deleted but before it was, Mendes got a chance to explain why she doesn't feel like the internet is a safe space for her children. "In my house, children do not have access to the internet as it's too dangerous. Just like drinking or voting or getting a driver's license (etc..) isn't allowed for children, the internet falls under that category for me. Especially social media".

While Mendes and Gosling—who've been together since 2011—are notoriously private about their family life, the couple have shared a few details about raising children together. During an interview with *Byrdie* in July 2022, Mendes explained that she and her partner want to make sure that their children feel confident in themselves throughout everything they do in life. "Hopefully Ryan and I are doing the work by just loving them, and doing most of that work for them so that they grow up feeling like they're enough", she said. "That's the one thing that's really important to me. Because once they feel like they're enough, no matter what they do, no matter what they end up doing, that will contribute to every area of your life".

Mysterious masked guards in pink boiler suits, a singing giant doll, and a life-changing sum of money... This can only mean the return of *Squid Game*

The Netflix hit has come back to our screens, but this time with a reality game show spin-off called *Squid Game: The Challenge*. Over 450 real players battle it out for a \$4.56m (£3.66m) prize, one of the biggest cash prizes in TV history.

The show kicks off with hundreds of contestants in green tracksuits trying to cross a line without being seen. Their mission is to get past a 4.2m doll that is furiously spinning her neck. In Red Light, Green Light, radio-controlled exploding dye takes out the players who have tripped over—instead of a fatal bullet as in the fictional version. "It felt like it was real, it didn't feel like you were in a fictional place", Lorenzo Nobile told BBC News. He described it as the physically hardest game on the show: "I made it past the line in seven hours, that was a very long time, but it's called *Squid Game: The Challenge*, it's not an all-inclusive holiday in the Canary Islands".

The show made headlines earlier this year because some of the contestants received medical treatment during filming and complained about the cold conditions during freezing UK weather. The huge prize attracted applications from 81,000 people from around the globe which were finally cut down to 456 apparently normal people—unlike the similar Netflix reality competition show *Physical: 100*, which gathered a hundred South Korean competitors at peak fitness, including national athletes and bodybuilders. *Squid Game: The Challenge* players ranged from a mother and son to the oldest contestant at the age of 69. "We were interested in the games as a test of human nature, so we wanted the widest possible variety of people", explained one of the show's executive producers, John Hay.

When the players were not participating in original games from the series like intricately cutting out umbrella-shaped honeycomb wafers with a needle, they were fully immersed in the *Squid Game* universe—no phones, confined to a prison-style dormitory, sleeping on five-bed-high bunk beds, and surviving on rationed food served by threatening guards. The Big Brother-like living space also provided ample time for alliances to form. In this new edition, players were also given chances to eliminate others, as part of the producers' aim to create drama and reveal players' characters between games.

The drama's creator Hwang Dong-hyuk had previously said the story "was an allegory or fable about modern capitalist society". In the original drama, Netflix's most watched series, South Korean contestants with many debts competed in a series of children's games for a huge cash prize won only by the last surviving player. Executive producer Hay points out that this show is flipped so it's driven by opportunity rather than need. "We are giving them the most enormous opportunity and it turns out that's as strong as a motivation and story".
