GUNS IN THE USA

Of the many words synonymous with the USA (freedom, wealth, American dream), gun violence, unfortunately, is one of them. In the year 2022 alone, there were over 45 thousand gun-related deaths on American soil. Over 6,000 children were killed or injured by gunfire and either intentional or indirect use of guns. Gun violence has recently surpassed car accidents as the greatest threat to American youngsters in causes of death. Suicide by guns has also reached an almost historic peak, with an estimated 7.5 gun suicides per 100,000 people. Incidents like the mass shootings in Dallas, Texas; Nashville, Tennessee; Buffalo, New York, and Uvalde, Texas, continue to have cities in mourning and have sparked repeated calls for stricter laws to control gun ownership.

In response to these concerns, President Joe Biden is trying to restrict access to guns. However, the laws and policies are almost impossible to change. The Second Amendment of the US Constitution states that the right of the people to bear and keep arms has to be respected. This amendment was written after the American Revolution to make sure that if the American government turned corrupt and infringed on the fundamental human rights of the Americans, the people would have the power and weapons to overthrow the government and fight for their own rights. On a deeper level, gun restrictions are very hard to implement due to the inherent mindset of US citizens; that of freedom. The government cannot violate human liberties, and one of those liberties is the ownership of guns.

Besides, although the majority of Americans believe that gun violence is a significant problem in society, the American population is evenly divided into whether gun ownership increases or decreases safety in America. About half say it helps to increase safety by allowing citizens to protect themselves, but an equal share says gun ownership reduces safety by giving too many people access to firearms and, consequently, by increasing gun misuse. According to the Pew Research Center, personal protection (72%) tops the list of reasons gun owners give for owning a firearm. Considerably smaller shares say that a major reason they own a gun is for hunting, for sport shooting, as part of a gun collection or for their job.

CHATGPT

ChatGPT is a conversational artificial intelligence (AI) from the research laboratory OpenAI. It can assist with various tasks, from answering questions to writing content. It's like having a bright friend you can chat with anytime and anywhere! You can ask questions on many topics, and it can even help you write creative stories. But here's where it gets interesting. ChatGPT has become a common resource for academic help, with 30% of college students using the platform for schoolwork. Students find the app handy for things like brainstorming essay topics or getting clarification on complex subjects. Using AI tools like ChatGPT for essays eliminates the need to spend hours researching or drafting. It checks data from countless sources — meaning the information is usually comprehensive and well-articulated — which produces well-written content that often rivals human-generated work. ChatGPT can generate content quickly, letting students focus on other tasks or subjects.

In light of this, teachers are sounding the alarm. They're concerned that tools like ChatGPT might make it easier for students to submit work that isn't their own. Many teachers worry students might use the application to generate essays, potentially undermining the value of original work and academic integrity. Teachers want to assess students' understanding and skills, not a machine's. To address this, schools are using advanced plagiarism checkers and software designed to detect content generated by AI. Believe me, they're getting good at it and if you get caught, you could face severe consequences.

Here's my advice — if you're tempted to use ChatGPT to write your academic paper, think twice. The risks far outweigh the benefits. However, ChatGPT can be a helpful sidekick if used responsibly. For instance, you can use it to brainstorm ideas, summarize complex articles or generate an outline. You can blend technology with your original thoughts. Let ChatGPT help with the groundwork, but make sure the final essay screams "you." I advise using AI as a jumping-off point, but never letting it do all the talking. Be intelligent and strategic. Use these tools to your advantage, but remember, your unique voice and perspective are irreplaceable. Academic success comes from knowing when and how to use resources without sacrificing integrity.
